HOW DOES MPS PLACE STUDENTS?

MPS seeks equity, transparency, efficiency and convenience in its school placement process. All school placements consider several factors:

- Integration: Based on qualification for Educational Benefits
- Family choice: The student's attendance area community school or one of our citywide schools
- Available space/capacity: Where there is physical space within the building and classroom capacity
- **Placement priorities:**
 - Geography, where a student lives (community/citywide magnet)
 - 2. Community school capacity, which is available for students at highly requested community schools to make room for other students (citywide magnet only)
 - 3. Siblings who are attending the same school at the same time (community/citywide magnet)
 - 4. Integration, based on how many students are eligible for Educational Benefits in a school (citywide magnet only)
 - 5. Housing stability, to keep students experiencing homelessness or who are highly mobile in their same school (citywide magnet only)



citywide Magnet schools with **INNOVATIVE ACADEMIC CURRICULUM**

What to expect from MPS Citywide Magnet Schools

Citywide magnet schools welcome students from all neighborhoods across Minneapolis based on their interest in unique academic themes: Arts, STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics), STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art and Mathematics), Spanish Dual Language, Montessori and Global Studies & Humanities. In addition to a specialized focus, MPS citywide magnet schools immerse students in innovative learning experiences that support career development and encourage community and family involvement. Students must request to attend a citywide magnet school, and placement is made based on a lottery and available space.



GLOBAL STUDIES & HUMANITIES (PreK-8)

MPS Global Studies & Humanities students are invited to critically explore and examine our past, present and future as global citizens. Students are led academically through a social-emotional learning approach that builds empathy in the classroom. Through hands-on participation in service learning, collaborative projects, and student-led discovery, students gain a broader understanding of self, their community and the world.



MONTESSORI (PreK-5)

The MPS Montessori school provides a supportive, calm, caring environment that sparks every child's interests and promotes lifelong learning. Students learn in multi-age classrooms and interact daily with peers at different grade levels to extend their learning. Montessori materials are used to help students learn concepts concretely, which leads them to understanding abstract concepts. All concepts start with seeing the whole to the parts and back to the whole again.



STEM/STEAM (PreK-8)

At MPS STEM/STEAM schools, students learn through project-based learning that uses student interest to address real world events. The projects require students to create solutions using knowledge from multiple subjects. Both the projects and thematic STEM/STEAM programming truly integrate knowledge from all academic subjects. A STEM/STEAM student is invited to work with others, share unique ideas, create new solutions and analyze information. Students are prepared for bright futures and careers through leadership opportunities and dedicated multi-purpose space for hands-on designing, inventing, engineering and robotics that also encourage flexibility and cultural awareness. At the high school level, students can continue STEM learning at their community high school and through participating in districtwide Career and Technical Education programs.



SPANISH DUAL LANGUAGE (PreK-12)

MPS Spanish dual language schools are offered to Spanish-and English-speaking students and speakers of other languages to learn Spanish and English. The goal is for students to emerge fully bilingual and biliterate in English and Spanish, to gain cross-cultural appreciation and to become prepared for a globally interdependent world. In these programs, students begin their experience primarily in Spanish, with more English content added each year. Dual language instruction is one of the most effective ways for English learners to develop their language and academic skills. After 5th grade, students can continue their dual language studies at Andersen United Middle School. At the high school level, students can continue their language studies at their community high school or as part of the Roosevelt Dual Language program.



ARTS (PreK-12)

Students interested in exploring dance, music, theatre and the visual arts will find a home at an MPS arts school. With at least three different arts-based experiences throughout each day, students develop their own unique approach to learning and problem-solving. Students will combine their skills and talents in the arts with core subjects such as English, math, science and social studies, expanding creative exploration and critical thinking opportunities. Family and community involvement in an arts school is key to success, especially as audience members. At the middle school level, students receive an arts experience through STEAM programming.

New this year, program continuation at Olson for grades 6–8, followed by Henry (Hmong Heritage and Hmong World Language Courses) for grades 9–12 for students who already speak Hmong.

Safe transportation

MPS safely transports to and from school eligible students in grades PreK-8 and those receiving special education services. In high school, we partner with the City of Minneapolis so students can take Metro Transit to school, work and extracurricular activities. That same option is now also available to some middle school students. MPS determines eligibility for transportation based on a number of factors, including where students live, what school they attend, and what services they qualify for. Exceptional English Learner (EL) services

EL services in our schools help students learn to listen, speak, read, and write in English. All students with a home language other than English are assessed upon enrollment to determine eligibility. If you are eligible for services, staff will follow up with additional information.

Supportive Special Education services

We welcome all students with special needs and disabilities and support them through Special Education services. To receive Special Education services, a student must be evaluated and meet state criteria. Eligible students can receive services from birth through age 21 or completion of a secondary education program, and staff will work with families to develop an Individualized Education Plan (IEP) for the student.
